The Weighted Scoring Breakdown

The system rewards breadth and depth across four primary categories:

1. Conference Experience

Not all conferences are weighted equally; the scale rewards the event's logistical and competitive complexity.

- **Local (0.5 pts):** Standard domestic simulations (e.g., KMIDSMUN).
- **Local International (1.0 pt):** Hosted domestically but with international standards/participants (e.g., THAIMUN).
- **Abroad (2.0 pts):** Requires international travel, demonstrating a high level of commitment and exposure (e.g., HMUN).

2. Awards & Recognition

Points are tiered based on the achievement's prestige and specific nature.

- **Overall:** 3 points
- **Chairing Awards:** 2 points
- **Committee Awards:** 1 point
- **Debate-specific Awards:** 1 point

3. MUN Initiatives

This rewards leadership and "giving back" to the circuit through organising or starting new programs.

- **Local Initiatives:** 1 point
- **International Initiatives:** 2 points

4. Related Knowledge & Academics

This section ensures chairs have the intellectual "meat" to handle complex topics.

- **Formal Education (3 pts):** Specialized classes outside core subjects (e.g., Economics, Global Politics, Law).
 - **Self-Guided Research (1.5 pts):** Independent projects or deep-dives into specific global issues.
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Administrative Requirements

The system operates on a **strict evidence-based policy**.

- **Submission:** All claims must be backed by evidence (certificates, transcripts, etc.).
 - **Format:** Documentation must be compiled into a **single PDF**.
 - **Portal:** Submissions are only accepted via the official **Google Form**.
 - **Penalty:** Any point claim lacking PDF evidence will be automatically disqualified from the tally.
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The Interview: The Final "Human" Filter

The score is not the final verdict. **Interviews** are used as a balancing mechanism.

- **High Scorers:** May be reconsidered if the interview reveals a lack of soft skills or leadership presence.
- **Lower Scorers:** May be "bumped up" if they demonstrate exceptional potential, nuance, or expertise that wasn't fully captured by the point system.
